As you know, Brentwood Secondary College is an outstanding school and one of the leading public schools in the North Eastern Region. As the School Council President, I share your pride in our school.

Brentwood is sought after by families within and beyond our local area. This is as a result of providing not only high-class learning opportunities in the classroom but outstanding experiences in the arts, sport, leadership, music and a large number of extra-curricular opportunities. Supporting this is a well resourced Wellbeing Team, Library and Pathways Team.

The Department of Education provide Brentwood Secondary College with funding for tuition and the everyday running of the school. Parent contributions ensure ongoing improvement and that the following programs and resources are able to be maintained by the College:

- Our comprehensive Wellbeing Team which is resourced beyond other local schools. It includes five non-teaching staff and a College Chaplain which the school funds. This team provides support to all students, staff and parents in our community.
- State of the art ICT infrastructure to support student learning. The school has its own dedicated internet and filtering software in addition to what the Department of Education provides to ensure students are able to access their learning programs anytime, anywhere. This includes employing two extra staff to support students.
- Extra support staff to supervise and provide First Aid, facilities management and gardening.
- A welcoming and friendly library with three non-teaching staff who support teachers and students by providing a quiet study space and help with accessing valuable learning resources.
- Performing Arts, Music and other resources that support both the curriculum and co-curricular programs. School musical and performing arts productions are award-winning and highly respected in the local and wider community.
- The delivery of our large sports program that continues to achieve outstanding results and provides our students with a wide range of opportunities.
- Elective subjects such as Food Studies, Drama, Art Making and Exhibiting, Media, Visual Communication and Product Design.
- School funded capital works program which will see construction beginning in 2024 on two new outdoor basketball courts, K block courtyard and an upgrade to the Library.

# PARENT PAYMENTS POLICY OVERVIEW



## FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



## PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

<b>Curriculum Contributions</b>	<b>Other Contributions</b>	<b>Extra-Curricular Items and Activities</b>
Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.	Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.	Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



## FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



## SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
